

# KEEPING STUDENTS ON TRACK FOR GRADUATION

Over the past year, we have taken significant steps in empowering Duval County students to achieve in school and succeed in life. The Duval County Public Schools graduation rate has continued to improve with a reported four percent increase from last year. The 2017-2018 graduation rate is more than 85 percent and is a county record.



## **PROGRAMS**

#### Literacy:

Reading is the most important skill for students to develop as it sets the foundation for their entire academic careers. The Duval Reads Literacy Program provides intensive one-on-one and small group literacy tutoring for students in elementary school.

#### Afterschool:

Many of the toughest challenges for students occur after the school bell rings. Whether they face hunger or social challenges, elementary and middle school students find a safe environment at our afterschool program to complete homework, participate in enrichment activities and connect with their classmates.

### Case Management:

We place full-time site coordinators directly on school campuses throughout Duval County to support students who are at risk of falling behind or dropping out. Our case management program provides access to many important services, including food assistance, home visits and coordinated parental involvement.

### SIGNATURE EVENT

Our annual Rising Stars fundraiser gives our students the opportunity to showcase their talents while raising funds for the programs in which they participate. This past year, more than 400 people attended the event, raising \$42,000. This fundraiser, held in the spring, continues to improve each year and celebrates our students' accomplishments inside and outside of the classroom.
